

There arose a fierce gale of wind, and the waves were breaking over the boat so much that the boat was already filling up. Jesus Himself was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?" And He got up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Hush, be still." And the wind died down and it became perfectly calm. -(Mark 4:37-39)

I served as a firefighter up in the Texas panhandle for a number of years; and you might be surprised at how crazy busy a rural, regional fire department can really be. We served a wide area encompassing several local communities, two major highways, a railway, various pipelines, a lake, and several thousand square miles of farm and ranch land. We had a running joke among us that, whenever someone would ask us what it was like to serve on fire and rescue, we would tell them: "Well, it's basically a lot of long hours of general boredom — punctuated here and there by moments of sheer terror!"

Life can be a lot like that, can't it? Generally speaking, we're all pretty much "nose to the grindstone" and just doing our best to take care of business. Our day-to-day endeavors can sometimes feel rather tedious, and our daily routine becomes monotonous. Then, the storm hits and knocks us for a loop. And we find ourselves struggling for air and thinking to ourselves – "this is NOT the kind of break in the routine that I was hoping for." When I read about those disciples who actually got to walk and talk with Jesus back in the 1st century, I get the distinct impression that their lives were a lot like that, too. There were plenty of quiet moments for just listening and learning punctuated here and there by episodes of sheer shock and dismay. It had to have been a pretty wild ride.

But you know what I see? I see that, no matter how stressful the situation, Jesus always had their back. He sheltered them. He protected them. He helped them navigate the stormy seas raging all around them. He wanted them to know that, so long as they remained with Him, faith intact, they were going to be okay.

Life is going to happen — with or without our approval. And, sometimes, the swelling seas raging all around us can become rather frightening. But I'm thinking, it's a whole lot safer to be in the boat with Jesus, than to be out there doing my own thing and trying to face the tempest all alone. $\sim Phil$




